## Celebrating 10 Years at ELTHAM's City Campus



ELTHAM's dynamic Year 9 Program is personally challenging and academically rigorous. It promotes self-directed learning, teamwork, independence and responsibility. It responds to the learning and social needs of adolescents and prepares them for the life work decisions demanded by senior studies and life beyond school.

In 2006 four days a week will be spent at our acclaimed City Campus – an innovation in education in Victoria for the past 10 years and still breaking ground today. At the Flinders Lane campus students undertake in-depth projects, visit cultural and historical sites in the city, confront urban environmental and community issues, and interact with the wide range of people in the multicultural city of Melbourne.

Students will return to the Research Campus for one day each week to participate in additional language study, specialist subjects and interschool sport. Over the course of the year, students will also spend two intensive blocks at the Research Campus. During their program all students will experience working at the Year 9 Swaps

Gully Coffee Shop at ELTHAM's Hospitality Training Centre. They all attend a weekend-a-week of Outdoor Education and embark upon their subject selection process for senior schooling. Year 9 students will complete this program with a strong sense of their personal achievement and an understanding of their relationship to the converging worlds of study and work. Mentoring and the development of life-long learning skills and relationships are at the core of the Year 9 city experience, with teachers providing a secure, caring and supportive environment in which students can grow and learn.

The Year 9 experience is just one of the many innovative programs ELTHAM has on offer. Years 3 and 4 students work with their teachers to develop critical skills and emotional intelligence in the College's History Centre, celebrated in educational circles both locally and overseas. Students in the Senior School enjoy curriculum offerings across Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) studies, vocational studies and University studies, for broader and more convergent than the vast majority of Victorian schools.

ELTHAM Year 9 students are educated in the best of knowledge and schooling practices: shared decision making, the ability to be self-directed, life long learners and the capacity to self-manage and reflect. These qualities, together with the resilience, critical skills and emotional intelligence attributes that are sign-posted through the program, recognise that the city and the work place have changed and that students need to be equipped to deal with the challenges, risks and excitement inherent in this new environment.

To quote graduating City Campus student Annelie: "Instead of sitting in a classroom and learning about city life, we are off on this experiencing it for ourselves. As a result, we have become more aware, independent and responsible."



## NEW LOOK ELTHAM FOUNDATION WORKS OFF SOLID FOOTINGS



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The Foundation's legacy arose during ELTHAM College of Education's early years from a committed group of ELTHAM parents. They recognised the need for specific funding to build additional infrastructure around the College to improve facilities and the general educational experience for their children and fellow students.

## LAURIMAR CHILD CARE AND EARLY LEARNING CENTRE ON TRACK TO OPEN MAY 2006



Construction is now well underway for the 120 place Laurimar Child Care and Early Learning, due to open on May 1, 2006. With the foundations, plumbing, and concrete poured, it is set to become an important space to the surrounding area, in which around 3,000 new homes are being constructed.

Strong community interest has resulted in the development of a waiting list for the facility which will be managed by ELTHAM Foundation.

"The Laurimar Estate's master plan always recognised this site as ideal for a child care and early learning centre. It's located close to the proposed Laurimar Primary School so there's a sense of continuity for the children," says Allen Williams, ELTHAM Foundation Chairman. "Its corner location on one of the main roads coming into the area also makes a highly visible."

ELTHAM Foundation already manages Eltham North Child Care and the Board has been reviewing other child care opportunities in the Melbourne market.


## XX CRICKET

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## NEW DIRECTIONS FOR ECCA

The growth of ELTHAM College of Education since its establishment 31 years ago has been phenomenal, and the ECCA Education Community Association is pleased of the role it has played in that development, particularly with respect to its assistance in funding several of the school's facilities.

The College has now completed its early development phase and the focus has shifted to consolidating enrolments at that to the current level of around 1100. ECCA views the best way forward to help the school is by creating strong friendly networks within the College community. Not only do parents gain personally from such friendships, but they are more likely to support College activities and to promote ELTHAM positively to the wider community.

For example, on 29 January 2006, ECCA will host welcome barbecues for families from each of the incoming Year 7 classes. Year 7 teacher mentors will also attend. The new Year 6 parents have agreed to help plan the functions and to act as hosts on the days.

Another aspect of ECCA's reform is its focus on raising the profile of the College. The NSW Retailer, Midford, was appointed to run the Uniform Shop from October 2005 to the end of 2006. This permanent commission on sales of all new uniforms (second-hand sales will be continued) where ECCA and ELTHAM uniforms will still be made by the College Uniform Committee, on which ECCA is represented.

## ECCA'S FRIENDS

In the past 18 months three new Friends Of ECCA (FOEs) have been formed. Snow Sports, Aerobic and Endurance, bringing a large number of FOEs associated with ECCA. The remainder comprises three sports, Snow Hockey, Snow Soccer, Snow Canoeing, plus Music and the Early Learning Association.

The origins of the Friends Of concept at ELTHAM date back several years. Originally, the College took responsibility for arranging all sporting and other recreational activities. However, during the 1990s, the parent groups involved in these activities were encouraged to set up more responsibility structures in association with ECCA. That association continues to this day, but has been modified this year to the extent that the FOEs now have more financial autonomy and deal directly with the school's financial administration.

Each of the FOEs has membership on ECCA's Management Committee and all have access to the school's community centre - for example, through ELTHAM's weekly family newsletter, Family News. However, more can be done to help the FOEs, particularly with respect to raising funds for the development of sporting resources and related facilities. Ways of enhancing collaboration between ECCA and the FOEs are presently under consideration.

In forthcoming editions of this publication, each of the Friends Of ECCA will be sharing more of their current achievements and aspirations.
